



# **ASBMT Survivorship in HCT Special Interest Group**

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**1. Overview**

The ASBMT hematopoietic cell transplantation survivorship special interest group (HCT Survivorship SIG) focuses on post-HCT survivorship issues in both autologous and allogeneic recipients. The SIG provides an international forum for the exchange of ideas, educational initiatives, and facilitating collaborative research on issues of importance surrounding survivorship in HCT.

**2. Purpose**

We are soliciting research proposals which may be presented for discussion and feedback during the 2018 Survivorship SIG meeting during the Tandem Meetings. Attendees will offer feedback and investigators may seek collaborations. In contrast to the Center for International Blood and Marrow Transplant Research (CIBMTR) studies facilitated by Working Committees that are observational in design, the SIG will focus on prospective research studies of any late effects / complications of autologous or allogeneic transplantation. Psychosocial complications, financial toxicities and caregiver issues are included in the scope of survivorship.

The SIG does not have funding to support conduct of the research, but will serve as a facilitator for discussion and promoting collaborative research efforts.

**4. Selection for Presentation Process**

All proposals will be reviewed by members of the SIG Steering Committee but, depending on the number of proposals submitted and time constraints, not all will be discussed at Tandem. The selection of proposals to be presented will be based on the scientific merit, collaborative potentials, novelty, and overall benefits to the field of survivorship. However, feedback will be provided on all proposals submitted. The selected concepts will be discussed during the 2018 Survivorship SIG meeting at the Tandem Meetings in **Salt Lake City on Wednesday February 21, 2018, 7:00 am – 8:30 am**. During the discussion we will focus on the study design, aims, scientific merit of the concept as well as potential funding opportunities.
